## NOTE FROM OUR CEO AND CVO

As we conclude another remarkable year, the YMCA of the Northwoods proudly reflects on a year defined by growth, stewardship, innovation, and deepened community impact. Together, we have advanced our mission with purpose and positioned our association for a strong and sustainable future.

Nearly one year after its grand opening, the Flambeau River YMCA has firmly established itself as a vibrant center for connection, wellness, and opportunity. Over the past year, this branch has introduced meaningful mission-driven initiatives, including an early childcare center supporting working families, middle school youth scholarships that expand access to enrichment and development, LIVESTRONG® at the YMCA for cancer survivors, Forever Well programming for active older adults, a recital-based dance program nurturing creativity and confidence, Membership for All scholarships ensuring accessibility regardless of income, and expanded teen engagement opportunities. These efforts represent more than program growth; they reflect our steadfast commitment to strengthening individuals and families throughout the Northwoods region.

Across our association, membership continues to grow, reflecting the trust our community places in our mission and the value of belonging. This year we launched a regional training hub to elevate professional development and leadership excellence among our staff. Our YMCA of the USA competitive gymnastics team achieved a historic milestone by earning six national medals at its first national competition, a testament to the dedication of our athletes and coaches. We celebrated renewed mission support through the most successful gala fundraising event in our history, demonstrating the generosity and belief of our donors. A team of volunteers concluded their findings for early childcare sustainability with a 3-year comprehensive plan. Additionally, we began the rigorous Praesidium Child Abuse Prevention Accreditation process, reaffirming our unwavering commitment to providing safe, nurturing environments for children and youth. Our leadership and staff further strengthened community partnerships through active involvement in more than ten local organizations, including national advocacy for the Afterschool Alliance.

This year also marked an exciting chapter of exploration as we were invited by Lakeland area leaders and the Lakeland Fitness & Golf Center to assess the potential expansion of a YMCA presence in the Lakeland community. In partnership with the Lakeland Y Steering Committee, we conducted thoughtful listening sessions, comprehensive community needs assessments, pre-concept design exploration, and meaningful stakeholder conversations. This careful and data-informed approach reflects our commitment to responsible growth and ensuring that any future expansion meaningfully advances youth development, healthy living, and social responsibility for all ages.

As we look back on this extraordinary year, we do so with pride in our accomplishments, confidence in our strategic direction, and deep gratitude for our exceptional employees and dedicated volunteer Board of Directors. Their leadership, alongside the steadfast support of our members and community partners, fuels our continued momentum. 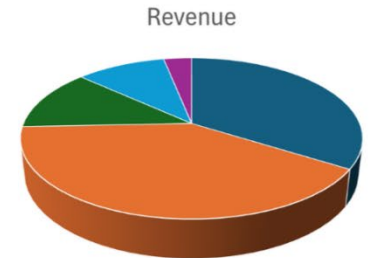

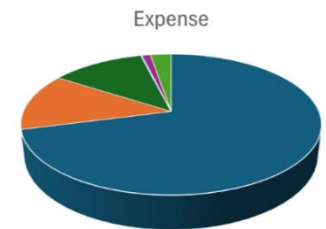
